I hope the new transition to Automated Curbside Pickup has been easy for you all. I send out notices on Voyent to remind residents of curbside collection days. If you have not already done so, please sign up!

Billing for the Garbage bins will be on your Water and Sewer bills. The cost is \$10.00 per month. If you have auto pay set up, remember to change the amount to \$100.00 to ensure you keep your account current. You are responsible for the replacement of your bin if it is damaged from negligence – ensure you store it close to your house so it does not get damaged by wind.

**Building Permits:** When doing home renovations, please remember that you must get a building permit for any interior work which alters the structure of your home. This would include windows of a different size, bay windows, moving walls or building a basement bedroom. If you have any questions you can call the office for clarification.

**Golf Cart Bylaw:** There has been lots of talk province wide over new Golf Cart Laws. These changes are different for each municipality. The Town of Watson is not making any changes to our current bylaw. Golf Carts are only allowed on roadways from your home to the golf course via the most direct route. If you have questions on this please call the office.
