2024 will be a huge year for our fire department. The Town of Watson has entered into an agreement to purchase the former OK Tire Building on Highway 6, to be used as our new fire hall. Equipment is getting larger and what we have now barely fits into the hall. A larger fire hall will also provide us with the space to create a regional EMO meeting center. In the event of any emergency we will be better prepared to protect our citizens. Our new fire hall will allow for the growth and expansion of our emergency services for the entire region.

The fire department has also ordered a new mobile command unit, to replace the one that is failing. Your volunteers have given countless hours of maintenance and service on this piece of equipment, but even their hard work and dedication cannot keep a worn out piece of equipment road ready. The volunteer fire men have been raising funds for some time to replace aging equipment. You can support the new Fire Hall or Equipment Fund by attending the fundraisers hosted for this purpose, or with a direct donation to the Town of Watson for the Fire Hall – building or equipment fund. We appreciate your support of this important part of Watson's core services.
